II. The target and subject of the agreement

- II.1. The above mentioned Parties commit to cooperate in the Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility exchange programme.
- II.2. The parties commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects of the organisation and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of the credits (or equivalent) awarded to students by the partner institution.
- II.3. The institutions also commit to sound and transparent management of funds allocated to them through Erasmus+.

V. Respect of fundamental principles and other mobility requirements

The higher education institution(s) located in a Programme Country of Erasmus+ must respect the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education of which it must be a holder. The charter can be found here: https://eacea.ec.europa.eu/erasmus-plus/actions/erasmus-charter en

V.2 The Parties must respect the following set of principles and requirements:

- Respect in full the principles of non-discrimination and to promote and ensure equal access and opportunities to mobile participants from all backgrounds, in particular disadvantaged or vulnerable groups.
- Apply a selection process that is fair, transparent and documented, ensuring equal opportunities to participants eligible for mobility.

- Ensure recognition for satisfactorily completed activities of study mobility and, where possible, traineeships of its mobile students.
- Charge no fees, in the case of credit mobility, to incoming students for tuition, registration, examinations or access to laboratory and library facilities. Nevertheless, they may be charged small fees on the same basis as local students for costs such as insurance, student unions and the use of miscellaneous material.

V.3 Before mobility, the higher education institution located in a Partner Country of Erasmus+ further undertakes to:

- Provide information on courses (content, level, scope, language) well in advance of the mobility periods, so as to be transparent to all parties and allow mobile students to make well-informed choices about the courses they will follow.
- Ensure that incoming mobile participants be given the same education and services as their own students, including integration, mentoring, providing information and language assistance.
- Ensure that student and staff mobility for education or training purposes is based on a learning
 agreement for students and a mobility agreement for staff validated in advance between the sending
 and receiving institutions or enterprises and the mobile participants.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining visas, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. Costs for visas can be covered with the mobility grants. See the information / visa section for contact details.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining insurance, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. The institution from the Partner Country should inform mobile participants of cases in which insurance cover is not automatically provided. Costs for insurance can be covered with the organisational support grants. See the information / insurance section for contact details.
- Provide guidance to incoming mobile participants in finding accommodation. See the information / housing section for contact details.

V.4 During and after mobility, the higher education institution located in a Partner Country of Erasmus+ further undertakes to:

- Ensure that incoming mobile participants be given the same education and services as their own students, including integration, mentoring, providing information and language assistance.
- Accept all activities indicated in the learning agreement as counting towards the degree, provided these have been satisfactorily completed by the mobile student.
- Provide, free-of-charge, incoming mobile students and their sending institutions with transcripts in English or in the language of the sending institution containing a full, accurate and timely record of their achievements at the end of their mobility period.
- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the Institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.

VI. Additional requirements

- VI. 1 The institution located in the Erasmus+ programme country provides mobility participants with services of travel and living they claimed, along the following guidelines:
- The institution located in the Erasmus+ programme country transfers 100% of the subsidy to cover costs of travel/living to the Hungarian bank account of participants of incoming mobility within 30 days from their arrival.
- The institution located in the Erasmus+ programme country transfers 100% of the subsidy to cover costs of travel/living to the bank account of participants of outbound mobility within 30 days from the day the participants have signed their contracts and submitted the required documents.
- The Parties agree that if the participant does not arrive at the institution located in the target country, or does not complete the period of mobility, the subsidy to cover travel/living costs be revoked fully or partly; the participant is compelled to transfer the specified sum back to the institution located in the

Erasmus+ programme country.

- VI.2. The Parties agree that the institution located in the Erasmus+ programme country be granted 100% of the organisational subsidy.
- VI.3 The Parties agree that the institutions located in the Erasmus+ programme country and the Erasmus+ partner country have a provision in their Regulations of Studies which discusses the acceptance and acknowledgement of courses completed by the participant.
- VI.4 In this round the Parties also agree that in case the participant does not complete the courses taken up at the institution located in the Erasmus+ programme/partner country, sanctioning will ensue according to the Regulations of Studies, Fees, or other relevant regulations used at the institutions in the Erasmus+ programme/partner country.
- St. Petersburg State University PIC: 999870569 acceptance of students and staff of disabilities is subject to additional negotiations and decision about acceptance is done according to needs of each case.

- VII.2 The receiving institution will send its decision to the sending institution within 1 week, for SPbU 10 work days.
- VII.3 A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 (five) weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving institution.

IX. Contact

IX.1 Any messages and declarations related to this agreement must be sent by mail to the specified contact person's address specifically designated for this purpose. Any changes in contact persons' names must be disclosed to the other party as soon as possible. The Parties take responsibility for the consequences of missing disclosure.

IX.2 The notification shall be considered as received:

- a. at the time of delivery in case of personal, conveyor or courier delivery,
- at the time of delivery indicated on the receipted mail, or if it is returned with "did not look" or "did not accept" labels,
- the 15th day after the day of posting registered mail,
- d. The e-mail shall be considered as received at the time when the contact person confirms reading

the letter, but failing to do this, the third working day after sending the letter (except in the case of an automatic out-of-office message).

IX.3 E-mail is not a valid channel to transmit declarations relating to ratification, modification or termination of contracts, certificates of completion, giving up rights, acknowledging rights, or making agreements.

IX.4 If urgent decisions or actions are needed, information may be transmitted via telephone and/or e-mail; they are later to be confirmed in writing.

X. Validity of the agreement

X.1 This agreement is valid for a set period, from 01.09.2017 to 31.07.2019. The agreement comes into force when the last of the Parties has signed it.

X.2 The Parties agree that this agreement may only be modified in writing by their authorised representatives.

X.3 This agreement will terminate

- if the set period elapses;
- if any Party ceases to operate and there is no legal successor;
- if the Parties jointly terminate it:
- if it is cancelled by any Party.

X.4 Before the end of the period specified in this agreement the Parties may jointly decide to terminate it, or any of the Parties may unilaterally cancel it in a legal declaration, in the way as follows:

- The Parties acknowledge that in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given.
- This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1.
- The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

X.5 Causes for inordinate termination include:

- If one of the Parties does not keep to the requirements taken on in the agreement or deriving from a legal regulation in spite of having been warned by the other Party(ies) in writing;
- If one of the Parties acts in a way which severely violates the law and which causes substantial material or moral damage to the other Party.

The inordinate termination must be sent to the other Party in writing, with the reasons attached.

XI. Other provisions

XI.1 To the agreement, legal regulations used in Hungary apply, such as Act 2011/CCIV. on national higher education, Governmental Decree 87/2015. (IV.9.) on enforcing certain provisions of Act 2011/CCIV. on national higher education and Act 2013/V. on the Civil Code.

XI.2 According to relevant legal provisions, in case a potential conflict over the interpretation, application or legitimacy of this agreement cannot be settled between the Parties, the Hungarian court before which the agreement was signed holds exclusive jurisdiction.

Six (6) original copies of the agreement have been printed, three (3) copies out of which will be given to the receiving institution, and three (3) copies to the sending institution.

The Parties have read and jointly interpreted the agreement - acknowledging the rights and obligations of one another - and signed it as a document which is fully consistent with their will.
